Twin Oaks Community

“Twin Oaks is an [intentional community](#) in rural central Virginia, made up of around 90 adult members and 15 children. Since the community's beginning in 1967, our way of life has reflected our values of cooperation, sharing, nonviolence, equality, and ecology. We do not have a group religion; our beliefs are diverse. We do not have a central leader; we govern ourselves by a form of democracy with responsibility shared among various managers, planners, and committees. We are self-supporting economically, and partly self-sufficient. We are income-sharing. Each member works 42 hours a week in the community's business and domestic areas. Each member receives housing, food, healthcare, and personal spending money from the community.”

Pleasant Grove Park and House Museum

Visitors can tour the 1854 home, browse the exhibit galleries, or visit our reading room to learn more about Fluvanna's history. This 800 acre park has something for everyone: Walk the Heritage Trail to the Rivanna River, take a jog on the cross country team's 5k loop, enjoy the 18+ miles of multi-use trails, or just come enjoy the natural habitat or bird watching. Over 20 miles of trails run through these habitats which contain a diverse population of wildflowers, animals and birds. Our river habitat is host to river otters, eagles and ducks while in our untended grassy fields you will see many songbirds, hawks, and rabbits. Walk our tree identification trail and learn the names of our many native Virginia trees.

The garden, located at Pleasant Grove Park, was developed jointly by Virginia Cooperative Extension, Fluvanna Master Gardeners and FCPR. The garden promotes productive gardening practices and conserving resources to enhance the surrounding environment. It also provides gardening opportunities for the physical and social benefit of the people and neighborhoods of Fluvanna County.
