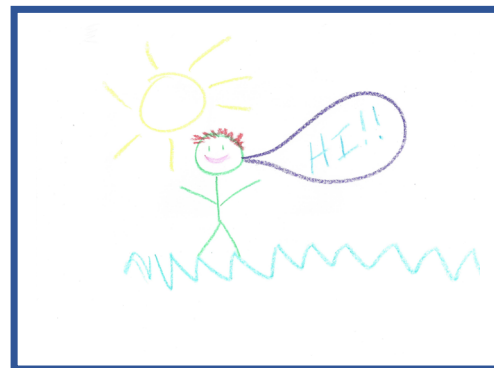
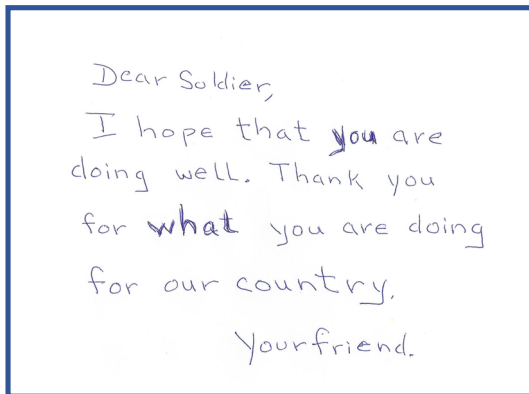
Write a Letter to a Service Member:

Things to consider when writing your letter. . .

- Be positive and encouraging.
- Thank them for their service.
- Let them know that you support them.
- Share inspiring quotes or drawings.
- Share your hobbies or things that interest you.
- Do not share personal contact information.
