# GUIDE to filling out the PORTFOLIO VIRGINIA 4-H SHOOTING EDUCATION PROJECT PORTFOLIO RIFLE

Please consider the following points when evaluating the proficiency of the 4-H member:

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of rifle safety, including safety considerations pertaining to:
  - Three basic rules of gun safety
    - MAT acronym
    - Knowledge of the three rules and what they mean
  - Proper use of a Clear Barrel Indicator
    - Describe what a CBI is
    - o Demonstrate how to use it properly
  - Equipment
    - o Procedure for uncasing / casing a rifle
    - How to make a gun safe
    - Use of the safety on a rifle (Don't depend on it. Since it is a mechanical device it can fail)
  - Use of appropriate ammunition
    - How do we determine what ammunition is appropriate for a gun?
  - Range operations

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- o Familiarity with the "CEASE FIRE" command should an unsafe condition be observed
  - Who can call "CEASE FIRE"?
  - How to call "CEASE FIRE"
  - What do you do, as a shooter, when "CEASE FIRE" is called?
  - What do you do if you have a loaded gun after the "STOP" command is given?
- What does the command "AS YOU WERE" mean? (rescinds previous command)
- What does the command "CARRY ON" mean? (proceed with actions prior to interruption)
- Malfunctions
  - What is a misfire? What do you do if you have a misfire?
  - What is a hangfire? What do you do if you have a hangfire?
  - What is a squib load? What do you do if you have a squib load?
- Personal protection
  - Use of eye and ear protection
  - Washing hands after each shooting session.
  - No eating or drinking while on the range

#### 2. Demonstrate knowledge of rifle equipment, including:

- Rifle types
  - Bolt action
  - o Lever action
  - Slide action (pump action)
  - Break open (hinged action)
  - Falling block
  - o Semi-automatic
  - Full automatic
- Parts of the rifle
  - o BASS (Barrel, Action, Stock, Sights)
- Ammunition (types, components, function)
  - Centerfire vs rimfire
  - How does a cartridge work?
- Rifle operation
  - Proper sequence for charging / loading an airgun
  - Proper procedure for mounting gun (do not mount gun by pointing anywhere above target)

- 3. Demonstrate proper rifle shooting form, including:
  - Eye dominance
  - Bench position
  - Prone position
  - Standing position
  - Kneeling position
  - Sitting position
  - Use of the sling in each position where appropriate
    - In which positions is a sling appropriate? (prone, kneeling, sitting. NOT standing)
  - Application of the five fundamentals of firing a shot
    - o Aiming
      - Eye relief
      - Sight alignment
      - Sight picture
        Natural Point
        - Natural Point of Aim
    - o Trigger control
    - Breath control
    - Hold control
    - Follow thru
- 4a. Demonstrate the ability to shoot a tight group in the bench position
  - with one or more of the following rifles. (standard set by leader):
    - BB Gun 5 meters Air Rifle - 10 meters 22 Rifle - 50 ft. or 50 yards
- 4b. Demonstrate the **ability to move the group** to the aiming point.
