



Virginia 4-H Contest Guide – Trash to Treasure

Description of Contest

Youth create an item from recycled materials. This item can be a decretive like a sculpture. It can also be useable, such as jewelry or games. Each unit may bring 5 entries per age level. Participant does not need to be present.

Levels of Competition

Unit (county), District

Age categories are as follows, using September 30th of the 4-H year as the determining date. The exception is for national contests, in which January 1 or another date may be used. It is the contestant's responsibility to check national rules for age deadlines.

Juniors (ages 9-11) Intermediates (ages 12-13) Seniors (ages 14-18)

Awards to be Earned

The Danish awards system will be used at all levels of competition. Blue ribbons will be awarded to competitors earning 90-100 points; red ribbons will be awarded to competitors earning 75-89 points; white ribbons will be awarded to competitors earning 74 points or less.

Rules for this Contest

- 1. All items must be made with recycled materials.
- 2. Categories are as follows: sculpture, jewelry, miscellaneous.
- 3. Items should reflect a new use of the recycled object (i.e. decorated can becomes a pencil holder; liter bottle becomes a bird feeder, etc.)
- 4. Each item must be labeled as decorative only or useable item and must be accompanied by a brief written explanation of materials and intended use.
- 5. Useable items must be able to withstand intended use (i.e. outdoor items must be weather resistant).
- 6. You may use glue or any other type of adhesive.
- 7. Paint, crayons, markers, etc. can be used for color or be creative with the materials you use (i.e. Coke boxes for red).
- 8. The name, age, unit and materials used in the project must be on a 3x5 card attached to the entry.
- 9. The categories are: sculpture, jewelry and miscellaneous.
