History of Virginia 4-H All Stars



Membership in 4-H All Stars is the highest recognition that a Virginia 4-Her can achieve. It is both an honor and a service organization. It is entirely volunteer operated. The 4-H All Stars strive for a cooperative effort with 4-H, which becomes the springboard from which All Stars jump to other areas of service throughout their lifetimes. The service to which All Stars are committed extends to schools, places of worship, communities, and beyond.

In August of 1922, three West Virginia All Stars initiated 12 Virginians who founded the Virginia All Star organization and became its first members. In 1923, they inducted 23 more 4-H'ers during 4-H Short Course (the predecessor of 4-H Congress) on the Virginia Tech campus. Over 10,000 All Stars have been tapped since 1922.

Like 4-H itself, the All Stars organization has grown, endured, and evolved. In the 1950s a maximum of two 4-H'ers could be tapped from a unit: one male and one female. Those tapped did not complete applications, and discovered that they had been selected when their names were called by the Scout. The ceremony was held outdoors in locations such as at the Drillfield. During the 1970s, the ceremony was held in Cassell Coliseum. Those tapped were watched during 4-H Congress for good behavior and the final vote for membership was held that week. In the 1990s, 4-Hers began filling out applications for membership and those selected were notified in the spring. The ceremony moved back outside around 2000.

We still feel connected to our camping heritage through our six Chapters. Chapter membership is determined based on which of the six 4-H Centers across the state the local unit uses for camp. These Chapters have various traditions and activities and always meet during the two state conferences held each year.

The applications and nominations of those who are invited to become 4-H All Stars today were examined by their units, their Chapters, and the State Membership Committee. Then, the membership voted to approve their acceptance at the Midwinter Conference. Their records met the high standards of the Virginia Chapter of 4-H All Stars and we expect that they will live our motto: **Service.**
