Edith Bolling Wilson Birthplace Museum – Casual Attire

Founded in 2005, the Edith Bolling Wilson Birthplace Foundation seeks to raise awareness and increase community appreciation of the birthplace and childhood home of

First Lady Edith Bolling Wilson. Born and raised in Wytheville, Virginia, Edith Bolling Wilson traces her ancestry to Pocahontas and is the only southern Appalachian-born First Lady. As one of only eight historic sites across the country dedicated to the interpretation of a First Lady, the museum tells the story of the overlooked, yet vitally important role Edith Bolling Wilson played in the White House at a pivotal moment during World War I.

The museum is one of two Presidential Historic Sites located in an American Main Street. The property is a contributing structure of the downtown Wytheville Historic District, which was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1994.

Airfield Chapter Report

The Airfield Chapter welcomed Hannah R. Bishop as our new chapter advisor. Hannah is a 4-H Extension Agent working with 4-H youth in Dinwiddie County.

Airfield Chapter reviewed youth and adult All Star nomination forms on November 16, 2022, at the Airfield 4-H Education Center.

We are looking forward to conducting Chapter meetings, electing new officers and conducting service projects within our large district. Information about Chapter activities will be provided to agents to send to Airfield Chapter All Stars.



Over a three-day period from Friday, July 22nd through Sunday morning, September 24th, the Virginia Chapter of 4-H All Stars celebrated 100 years of service in support of Virginia 4-H. From the opening picnic dinner under a tent on the lawn at The Inn at Virginia Tech, to the Sunday morning breakfast and Memorial Service, the consensus was that we had celebrated in style!

While 124 registered, only 114 attended due to Covid! Attendees included those tapped in the 1950's to those just tapped in 2022. In fact, some members were tapped on Saturday afternoon of the event.

Highlights included a look at our history presented by Irene Leech; recognition of our leadership and award recipients from over the years; remarks from 4-H All Star, and the CEO of the Virginia Tech Foundation Elizabeth McClanahan, former Virginia Supreme Court Justice; a campfire led by Sam Fisher; greetings from Provost Cyril Clark, CALS Dean Dr. Grant Allan, and Extension Director Dr. Ed Jones; and an inspirational keynote address by 4-H All Star and former Chief Justice of the Virginia Supreme Court, Cynthia Kinser.

Our floral table centerpieces were made by a few of the All Stars in attendance. They were placed in cloth covered containers made by Airfield Chapter Chief Jean Powers. Keepsakes with our Centennial logos included an insulated zipper cooler bag. Items in the bag included a mouse pad, ball point pen, 3-in-one charging cable, 5 x 7 hardcover journal, and a microfiber cloth. Items given out at meals were a business card size magnet, magnetic clip, and a ballpoint pen. At the banquet we toasted our 100th birthday with cake and sparkling apple cider in a souvenir wine glass.

The event had a full mixture of service projects, tours and workshops. Two of Virginia Tech's premiere programs hosted workshops: The Oris Glisson Historic Costume and Textile Collection and The Center for Real Life Design at VA Tech with participants noting the presentations as superb well as a hands-on drone workshop. Campus tours throughout the event included the VA Tech Dairy Science Complex at Kentland Farms, the Football Athletic Facilities, along with a walking tour of the VA Tech campus. Since All Stars motto is service, this group participated in a myriad of service. From cleaning flowerbeds and landscape to stocking shelves at the local AGAPE Center, to about a dozen participants donating blood at the New River Valley Blood Donation Center. During registration, members packaged collections from All Star participants of canned/non-perishable goods, old towels/sheets and stuffed animals for delivery to the AGAPE Center, Riner Animal Hospital and English Meadows Senior Living Center respectively. The afternoon service project was an All Star 100th Birthday Party celebration at English Meadows Senior Living Center for All Stars and residents.

The West Virginia 4-H All Star Chapter, our founder, was represented by several members and Big Chief Abe Schoonover. Maryland Big Chief Cindy Bell represented that Chapter along with several other Maryland 4-H All Stars. Virginia 4-H All Stars were present in 2019 when West Virginia celebrated their 100th anniversary and again in 2021 when Maryland celebrated their 100th anniversary.
