IN MEMORY

Dr. H. Lynn Moore, Jr., 89, of Staunton, VA , passed away on April 22, 2022 at his home. Dr. Moore was born on April 9, 1933 in Blacksburg, Virginia. He was in the 4-H All Star Hall of Fame, ran track at his alma mater, Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, and a member of the Highty-Tighties. After graduating from the Medical College of Virginia, he practiced medicine for 60 years and was the team doctor for Riverheads athletics since the school's inception in 1962. He received numerous awards and recognitions which he humbly accepted.

Donna Sue Potter, 68, of Somers, N.Y., died April 9, 2022, at her home. She was born March 19, 1954, in Lexington, the daughter of Emory Montgomery Potter Sr. and Bessie Greever Potter. She was a graduate of Lexington High School, class of 1972. She received a bachelor of science degree in food business from Virginia Tech and a master of business administration from the University of Kentucky. She retired as program director, Global Initiatives, Sales and Distribution at IBM. She credits much of her success in business to the training she received in 4-H particularly in public speaking and leadership skills. Donna loved to travel globally.

Austin Linwood Shepherd, 94, of Monterey passed away February 24, 2022. He was born January 12, 1928. After a stint in the Navy, he earned an Agricultural Degree at Virginia Tech and Masters Degree from North Carolina State. He was the Fredericksburg Belvedere Farm Manager and the Falmouth High School Ag Ed teacher. He served as the County Ag Extension Agent in Orange County for 7 years. In 1962, he became the Highland County Ag Extension Agent until his retirement in 1985. As a member of the Virginia and National Association of County Agricultural Agents, he received the Distinguished Service Award.

Paul Massie Saunders Sr., 88, passed in the midst of a large family gathering on March 11, 2022. Born on November 8, 1933, Paul lived most of his life at his family home in Nelson County. Paul was a loyal Virginia Tech Class of '54 alumnus and held season tickets to the football games for over 50 years. All his sons along with 18 grandchildren are either graduates or are now enrolled at Virginia Tech. He was a renowned expert and grew and sold boxwoods. Saunders Brothers, Inc. now grows and ships plants throughout the mid-Atlantic region and has supplied boxwood to the White House, Longwood Gardens, and other historic sites.

Virginia F. Saunders, 88, passed away on Friday, April 15, 2022, at her daughter's home in Fayetteville, N.C. Virginia was born in Cockeysville, Md., and lived in Virginia, Florida, and North Carolina throughout her lifetime. Virginia was an avid member in 4-H as an All-Star for many years. Virginia attended Towson State Teachers College.

Consecration Ceremony



A special thank you to the Ceremonial Committee for their great work! The draft Virginia 4-H All Star Ceremony was voted on and approved during the Midwinter Conference, February 5, 2022. Below is the approved 4-H All Star Ceremony. It will be used at the 2022 Ceremonies.

Instrumental music while people gather.
Ceremony begins as Song leader(s) lead All Stars singing “I Would Be True.”
All Stars enter, led by Big Chief and officers in the shape of the Circle. Big Chief and Scribe stand behind microphones at the head of the Circle and others form the Circle.

CHIEF: On behalf of the Virginia Chapter of 4-H All Stars, it is my privilege to welcome you to the *(insert year)* Consecration Ceremony. Today we celebrate *(insert years since 1922)* years of inducting All Stars in Virginia. For some of you, it is your first time seeing this ceremony. Perhaps you have questions about who and/or what a 4-H All Star is in Virginia. Membership in 4-H All Stars is the highest recognition that a Virginia 4-H’er, volunteer, or staff member can achieve. It is both an honor and a service organization. Our motto is service. Operated by volunteers, the 4-H All Star organization strives for a cooperative effort with the 4-H program in all areas. The 4-H program becomes the springboard from which an All Star jumps to other areas of service that continue throughout his or her lifetime. The service to which All Stars are committed extends to their schools, churches, communities, and beyond. Our first members were inducted in August of 1922 when three West Virginia All Stars initiated 12 Virginians who met and formed the Virginia All Star organization. The following year 23 more 4-H’ers were inducted during 4-H Short Course on the Virginia Tech campus. Over 10,000 All Stars have been tapped since then and many of the elements of the ceremony have been passed down through the years. Membership in the Virginia Chapter of 4-H All Stars is a privilege and high honor. Congratulations to those who are about to be inducted into the Chapter.
CHIEF: Scout, are all the worthy members assembled?
SCOUT: They stand within the Circle.
CHIEF: Let our Scribe read the message which calls us here.
SCRIBE: The many 4-H teens and adults who are striving to make their lives richer through the development of their head, heart, hands, and health have gathered. Let us find those who by rendering services to others and by their character, merit admission into this Chapter.
CHIEF: Is it then the desire of the Virginia 4-H All Stars assembled here that we send forth the scouts to bring to the Circle any worthy of admission into this organization?
ALL STARS: Send forth the scouts.
CHIEF: 4-H All Stars, we have in our records the names of those before us. Shall they be received into the Virginia Chapter of 4-H All Stars? Think carefully, then answer.
ALL STARS: Let us receive them. Instruct them that they may help us Serve.
CHIEF: Scout Eagle, come.

(Eagle Scout steps out of the Circle and turns right, walking around the outside of the Circle. Each scout steps out of the Circle after the Eagle Scout walks behind them, forming a line that enters the Circle, turns left, and standing in front of those in the Circle with the last scout standing in front of the Lesser Chief.)
Hear these words: The Virginia 4-H All Stars desire that you pass through this audience of teens and adults and bring those who have proven themselves worthy into the Circle.
(Scouts turn left and exit the Circle, walking around the outside of the Circle. They stop before signs for units with All Stars to be tapped and call the name(s). After crossing arms in front of their body, right arm over left, a scout takes a hand of each of the new All Stars. New All Stars do not cross arms. Then the scout and tappees on their left and right, proceed around the outside of the Circle, check in at the table and take their turn standing in front of the Chief.)

(continued)

SCOUT: I present *(insert name and unit)* and *(insert name and unit)*.
(Then all three turn and walk inside the Circle, entering on the left and walking clockwise. The scout leaves each standing facing an All Star inside the Circle, up to two in front of each All Star, and continues walking clockwise until leaving the Circle at the entrance or slipping between two All Stars and turning left to walk counterclockwise outside the Circle to the next person on the list.)
CHIEF: Admit *(insert first name)* and *(insert first name)*.
(After all the scouts complete their list and turn it in at the table, they return to their places in the Circle, walking counter clockwise on the outside of the Circle. When all have finished, the Scout goes and stands in front of the Chief.)
CHIEF: Are there others?
SCOUT: *(If necessary...)* If the following person/people are present, please meet me at the egristration table.
(Meet them and bring them into the Circle then return to stand before the Chief who asks again.)
CHIEF: Are there others?
SCOUT: There are no others at this time.
CHIEF: Scribe, do you have the records of those within our Circle?
SCRIBE: Their applications have been reviewed by our members and their names have been entered into our records.
CHIEF: They may remain within our Circle. *(Wait until the Scout returns to place in Circle)*
CHIEF: You have heard this most earnest desire of the 4-H All Stars. Our motto is “service.” You have your mind to continually train, your heart for inspiration and guidance, and your hands and body to serve. Aspire to live to the 4-H motto: “To make the Best Better” and the All Star motto: “Service”, so that the world may be better.Let these flowers be a token of our congratulations, love and confidence. *(All Stars pin a flower on each new All Star’s left shoulder.)*
Let us extend to them the hand of welcome. *(All Stars shake hands with each of the new All Stars standing in front of them.)*
CHIEF: Now, we will trade places with the new All Stars to signify that they are now active All Stars who have committed to a lif time of Service. *(Current All Stars take 2 steps into center of Circle and turn to their right so that they face the audience, reforming a Circle behind the new All Stars. Thus the new All Stars are facing the audience and become the focus of the celebration.)*

READER: WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE *(Read with expression. Reader may vary.)*
By the width of our smiles, People know we are there
By the depth of our service, We show others we care
For as much as we give, People know we are there
For as long as we live, We show others we care
Not a minute to lose, People know we are there
And the hour has come, To show others we care
When our service multiplies, People know we are there
When we add to their lives, We show others we care
We can make a difference, You and I
We can make a difference if we try.
