Silent/Live Auction Planned -Support Jamestown 4-H **Educational Center Restoration of Cabin While Honoring-**Sarah Gregory by Jim Hepner

4-H All Star Summer Conference is a few months away, but we want to start planning for and collecting items for our auction in Radford in July.

Those of you that attended the 2024 Summer conference in Woodstock may remember we raised \$3100 to assist Spencer and Diaz with expenses for their Virginia 4-H/Chile Exchange. Mr. Steve Wood suggest-

ed we do the same type of auction to raise funds and contribute to the restoration of a cabin at Jamestown 4-H Educational Center, Williamsburg, Virginia.

One of the cabins at the 4-H Center had significant damage during a storm. Crucial repairs are necessary to ensure the 4-H Center can continue to operate at full capacity for 4-H Camps this summer. The donation to the camp will be made in honor of Sarah Gregory, 4-H All Star and 4-H Volunteer. Sarah has been taking 4-H campers to the Jamestown 4-H Education 4-H Center every year since 1979. Ms. Sarah has been a very loyal, active member of Virginia 4-H All Stars in her unit, district, and at the State level. She has touched the lives of so many 4-Hers and All Stars. Sarah is very honored that we will contribute to the camp restoration in this manner.

We have asked Ms. Sarah Kohrs (Senk Pottery) to make 24 coffee mugs and 12 soup bowls for the benefit auction. She made 4-H soup bowls for our auction last summer. Other items auctioned last year were plants, baked goods, birdfeeders, crafts, gift cards that could be used throughout the state, and items donated by businesses. We also received monetary donations.

2025 4-H All Star Midwinter Conference Award Recipients!

Hall of Fame Award: Rory Nansel, is a 1998 4-H All Star from Shenandoah County who actively volunteers to support the county 4-H program as well as community organizations. He has served as Advisor, Treasurer and Lesser Chief at the unit and district levels and as Advisor on the State level. He is involved and gives leadership to many Shenandoah County 4-H All Star activities and programs. He volunteers with many county 4-H programs and is actively involved with 4-H International programs. He has chaperoned 4-H trips to Japan, Finland and the Dominican Republic. He also volunteers in the community as a member of the church choir, a community choir, fire fighter, EMT, etc.

Bradshaw Service Award: Lizzie Rhodes, 2013 4-H All Star from Shenandoah County, received the Bradshaw Service Award for her 13 years of service. She is active in several county groups/4-H programs such as the County 4-H Council, Dairy Show at the County Fair, and 4-H Honor Club as a 4-H Volunteer and 4-H All Star. She serves as the 4-H All Star Scribe and communicates with local All Stars about activities and opportunities for them. She maintains the county 4-H All Star mailing list and she is a role model for younger 4-H members and All Stars.

C. Dean Allen Award for Excellence: Carly Wright, 2006 4-H All Star from Loudoun County, is the 4-H Extension Agent in Loudoun County. Since she began work in 2013, Loudoun County has had 40 newly tapped 4-H All Stars. She has made the effort to involve 4-H All Stars in the local program by including them on the Extension Leadership Council, serve on the 4-H Honor club, and she involves them in planning, organizing and conducting programs and activities. Four families have hosted 4-H international program visitors. Four County 4-Hers have participated in the Dominican Republic program. Caryl promotes 4-H international programs to 4-Hers in Loudoun annually.

Kate Turner, a 4-H All Star from Surry County, is pursuing a master's degree at Radford University in General Curriculum Special Education to be Special Education teacher and receive a full licensure as a secondary special education teacher.

Guests may stop by Parking Services at 505 Beamer Way (7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday - Friday) prior to going to their destination to purchase their daily pass. Be sure to take the make, model, and year of your vehicle as well as license tag number with you.

Suggested Parking Areas - You may park in the Coliseum Parking Lot F/S/V/C/G which is near the Coliseum and Lane Stadium and Parking Services. Look for the 4-H signs at the Coliseum Parking lot.

Squires Student Center Parking- You may wish to park across the street from the Squires Student Center called Squires Lot F/S/V/C/G.

Two members of the Shenandoah Co. Chapter of 4-H All Stars were recognized as award winners during the 2025 MidWinter Conference in VA Beach. Lizzie Rhodes (Shen. '13) received the Bradshaw Service award for her 11 years of service. Lizzie made a seamless transition to serving as a 4-H volunteer after she graduated from 4-H. She serves as a 4-H Advisor for our Honor Club and Co. 4-H Council and also serves as Scribe for the County and District All Star Chapters. When Lizzie came to MidWinters, she thought she was going to give a speech to recognize our local chapter about why she stayed involved in 4-H. Surprise! She shared that she stayed involved to give back to the organization that she benefited from when she was a shy 4-H'er who was afraid to speak in front of people.

Rory Nansel (Shen '99) was recognized as a new Hall of Fame member. While Rory did not grow up in 4-H in Nebraska, he jumped in feet first when he met and married a VA 4-H Agent, 36 years ago. He has supported most local and many district and state 4-H programs, including giving leadership to 4-H International Trips to Japan, Finland and the Dominican Republic 8 different years. He has judged, taught classes, engineered sound systems, worked with inbound FLEX and Japanese exchange students and host families, and done whatever was needed to help with the Co. Fair 4-H/FFA Livestock Shows and Sale. He has held All Star offices at the county and district and is currently a State Advisor.
