Save Energy – Change Light Bulbs



Today there are many new light bulbs that are much more energy efficient than traditional bulbs. Many of them are fluorescent bulbs and they often come in unusual shapes. They cost more to purchase than do traditional bulbs, but just changing the five bulbs that you use the most in your home can save a lot. You can save more than \$60 every year in energy costs, and if all Americans do it, we can keep more than one trillion pounds of greenhouse gases out of our air. That's a \$6 billion energy savings for Americans and it's equivalent to the annual output of more than 21 power plants. These bulbs typically last much longer than traditional bulbs; it's not unusual for them to last for years. Look for Energy Star labeled bulbs. You can find more information at www.energystar.gov

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAW AMENDMENTS FOR REVIEW

Please review the following proposed Constitution and Bylaw amendments. In accordance to our Bylaws, the proposals have been reviewed by the Executive Committee and are being published with meeting notification. These amendments will be voted on at the general business meeting during MidWinter Conference.

In order to clarify the role and remove possible concerns for Native Americans, it is proposed to change the title of Medicine Man to Treasurer. This would affect the following portions of the Constitution and Bylaws: Constitution:

Article IV Officers and Elections, Section 1:

Currently – The officers of this Chapter shall be Big Chief, Lesser Chief, Recording Scribe, Corresponding Scribe, Scout, and Medicine Man.

Proposed – The officers of this Chapter shall be Big Chief, Lesser Chief, Recording Scribe, Corresponding Scribe, Scout, and <u>Treasurer</u>.

Section 2: Currently – The officers shall be elected at the Summer Meeting. They shall serve only one year in any one office, or until their successors are duly qualified and elected, except for Medicine Man. The Medicine Man may succeed himself for any number of years in office. In the event that an unusual situation should prevent the holding of the Summer Meeting, the elected officers shall serve until the next Summer Meeting is held. Proposed – The officers shall be elected at the Summer Meeting. They shall serve only one year in any one office, or until their successors are duly qualified and elected, except for Treasurer. The Treasurer may succeed himself for any number of years in office. In the event that an unusual situation should prevent the holding of the Summer Meeting, the elected officers shall serve until the next Summer Meeting is held.

Bylaws:

Article III Duties of Officers Section 1 F.

Currently – Medicine Man shall:

- 5. Have the right to appoint, with the concurrence of the Executive Committee, an assistant Medicine Man. Proposed Treasurer shall:
- 5. Have the right to appoint, with the concurrence of the Executive Committee, an assistant <u>Treasurer</u>.

Section 2 – District Officers

Currently - District and unit 4-H All Star organizations shall have duly elected officers of Chief, Scribe, <u>Medicine Man</u>, and other officers as deemed necessary.

Proposed – District and unit 4-H All Star organizations shall have duly elected officers of Chief Scribe, <u>Treasurer</u>, and other officers as deemed necessary.

Article IV Standing Committees, Section 1 – Executive Committee

Currently – The Executive Committee shall be composed of the following members – Big Chief, Lesser Chief, Recording Scribe, Corresponding Scribe, Scout, <u>Medicine Men</u>, retiring Big Chief, District Chiefs, and one person from the State 4-H Department to be named by the Director, 4-H Programs.

Proposed – The Executive Committee shall be composed of the following members – Big Chief, Lesser Chief, Recording Scribe, Corresponding Scribe, Scout, <u>Treasurer</u>, retiring Big Chief, District Chiefs, and one person from the State 4-H Department to be named by the Director, 4-H Programs.

Section 6 – Audit Committee

Currently –It shall be the duty of this committee to review the books of the <u>Medicine Man</u> annually and submit a report to the membership.

Proposed – It shall be the duty of this committee to review the books of the <u>Treasurer</u> annually and submit a report to the membership.

Section 7 – Budget Committee

Currently – The Medicine Man shall be the Chairman.

Proposed – The Treasurer shall be the Chairman.

The following are additional proposed amendments.

Bylaws: Article I, Section 4 - Honorary Members

A. Currently – The State 4-H Staff may nominate a maximum of six (6) <u>unit Extension agents</u> and four (4) state or district Extension personnel for Honorary membership. These current or retired nominees shall have rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program for at least seven (7) years, two of which shall have been in Virginia.

Proposed – The State 4-H Staff may nominate a maximum of six (6) <u>unit Extension staff</u> and four (4) state or district Extension personnel for Honorary membership. These current or retired nominees shall have rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program for at least seven (7) years, two of which shall have been in Virginia. *This change would allow units to nominate program assistants and technicians in addition to agents.

B. Currently - The unit membership committee may annually nominate two (2) adult volunteer leaders for honorary membership into the Virginia Chapter of 4-H All Stars. A maximum of eighteen (18) adult leaders may be inducted annually into membership. A nominee must have rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program for at least seven (7) years, two of which shall have been in Virginia.

Proposed - The unit membership committee may annually nominate <u>three (3) adult volunteer leaders</u> for honorary membership into the Virginia Chapter of 4-H All Stars. A maximum of eighteen (18) adult leaders may be inducted annually into membership. A nominee must have rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program for at least seven (7) years, two of which shall have been in Virginia.

*This change would afford units the opportunity to nominate more deserving leaders per year.

After a short business meeting, we will board our motorcoach for the ride to Norfolk where we will spend the afternoon touring Nauticus and the Battleship Wisconsin. We will return to the Embassy Suites in time for the evening reception before our "Stars and Stripes" banquet. After a day of catching up with old friends and making new ones, join us for our service project. We will be putting together "Care Packages" for military personnel deployed overseas. Sunday morning will bring another made-to-order breakfast followed by vespers, I FYE presentations, our final business meeting (remember to read the proposed ByLaws changes located in this issue of The Star) and district meetings.

Our host hotel for the conference will be the Embassy Suites. Room rates will be \$79.00/ night. You will have a Two Room Suite with two Double Beds or a King Size bed plus a Sofa Bed.

You'll also have your own refrigerator and microwave. Other amenities include the indoor pool, spa and fitness center. This rate is guaranteed until January 4th, 2005. To make reservations, call 1-800-333-0924 and let them know you are making reservations for the 4-H All Star Midwinters Conference.

DIRECTIONS TO THE EMBASSY SUITES: Take I-64 to Exit 238 (Camp Peary Exit). Turn onto Route 143 East. Turn right onto Route 132 South (2nd light). At first light, turn right onto Route 60 West; go one mile and turn right onto Waller Mill Road at the second traffic light (Uno's Restaurant on right-hand corner at that intersection). Make first left onto Mooretown Road, and Embassy Suites will be on your right, directly behind K-mart.

Care Package Information: We would like to address these care packages to specific individuals so please check in your local area to see if there are any deployed military personnel (they do NOT have to be All Stars). If so, bring their exact mailing information with you to Midwinters. We will need boxes and packing materials (both must meet USPS regulations) as well as items for our care packages. Some acceptable items include phone cards, toiletry items (except razor blades), stamps and other correspondence items, magazines, paperback books, snack foods such as hard candies or mints, and playing cards. It would also be nice to include notes of support in each care package.

RESTRICTED ITEMS include: fruits, live plants, preserved meats, tobacco products, and coffee.



Dear All Stars.

Fall is the time to nominate eligible 4-H members to be tapped as Virginia 4-H All Stars during the 2005 State 4-H Congress. The following forms and supporting information can be found on the All Star website: http://www.ext.vt.edu/resources/4h/allstars.html

All Star nomination process flowchart

Basically, unit agent sends forms to eligible members, meets with local All Stars to review the nominations and sends the completed nominations to the district office by December 1.

All Star nomination form

There is no limit to the number of youth nominees that a unit can submit.

Nominees should:

- 1. Have completed at least 3 years of work as a 4-H member.
- 2. Be at least 15 years of age as of January 1 of the current year.
- 3. Be an active 4-H member and no more than 19 years of age as of January 1 of the current year or, have been an active 4-H member and no more than 19 years of age as of January 1 of the preceding year (Four-H'ers have an additional year of eligibility beyond the age for participating in other 4-H recognition opportunities.)

Honorary All Star nomination form

Each Extension unit may nominate three (3) adult volunteer leaders for consideration as honorary members. Nominees must have rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program over a period of not less than seven (7) years.

Nomination Summary Sheet

Use to list the nominees from the unit.

Awards and Recognition information

This is a good time to let current All Stars know about the \$600 Wayne Keffer Memorial Scholarship - form due on January 1 - for any All Star who is a college student or a graduate student.

See the website for more information on All Star Chapter Charters, Bradshaw Service Award and the All Star Hall of Fame Award. Also note that the C. Dean Allen Award for Excellence recognizes an agent who has excelled in All Star and/or international programming. Please take time to nominate an Extension Agent for this award. Form is due January 1. There is a cash award and a nice plague.

All of these delegates report that they really enjoyed their host families in Virginia, as well as all of the 4-H members that they had an opportunity to interact with at 4-H meetings and camps.



INTERNATIONAL FOUR-H YOUTH EXCHANGE OPPORTUNITIES

IFYE AMBASSADOR: For youths between the ages of 15-25, this program features a summer abroad. The purpose of the program is to assist youth in acquiring knowledge, developing skills, and farming attitudes that will help them become productive citizens of the global community through living with host families. Departure is in late June and return in early August. The fee for participation ranges from \$2,000—\$3,000, depending on the country.

IFYE REPRESENTATIVE: Participants between the ages of 19-30 can experience life in another country first-hand through living with host families for either three or six months. This is not the typical tourist's view of a

foreign land, but a chance to actually participate in daily living and learn about the customs and culture of another country while sharing about life in the United States. Representatives may pursue special interests through self-study, and many arrange for academic credit through their universities. Departure is in late June with return in September for three-month participants and in mid-December for the longer-term participants. The fee for the three-month exchange is \$2,200 for most countries, and the fee for the six-month exchange is \$2,500 for most countries (Australia costs \$1,200 more due to the greater airline expense).

Host families for inbound delegates are also needed. The average hosting period is three weeks, and families from all around the state give the delegates a good view of what life is truly like in Virginia.

NEW THIS YEAR—GROUP TOUR TO FINLAND: Six week tour for ages 15-19. Deadline for application January 1, 2005.
