





#### All Star nomination process flowchart

Basically, unit agent sends forms to eligible members, meets with local All Stars to review the nominations and sends the completed nominations to the district office by December 1.

#### All Star nomination form

There is no limit to the number of youth nominees that a unit can submit.

Nominees should:

- 1. Have completed at least 3 years of work as a 4-H member.
- 2. Be at least 15 years of age as of January 1 of the current year.
- 3. Be an active 4-H member and no more than 19 years of age as of January 1 of the current year or, have been an active 4-H member and no more than 19 years of age as of January 1 of the preceding year (Four-H'ers have an additional year of eligibility beyond the age for participating in other 4-H recognition opportunities.)

#### Honorary All Star nomination form

Each Extension unit may nominate three (3) adult volunteer leaders for consideration as honorary members. Nominees must have rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program over a period of not less than seven (7) years.

#### Nomination Summary Sheet

Use to list the nominees from the unit.

#### Awards and Recognition information

This is a good time to let current All Stars know about the \$600 Wayne Keffer Memorial Scholarship - form due on January 1 - for any All Star who is a college student or a graduate student.

See the website for more information on All Star Chapter Charters, Bradshaw Service Award and the All Star Hall of Fame Award. Also note that the C. Dean Allen Award for Excellence recognizes an agent who has excelled in All Star and/or international programming. Please take time to nominate an Extension Agent for this award. Form is due January 1. There is a cash award and a nice plaque.








Northwest and Southeast – Vespers and Memorial Service



### **Interstate Conference**



Maryland 4-H All Stars hosted the 2008 4-H All Star Interstate Conference July 31 - August 2. Conference location was the Wisp Resort in McHenry, MD. After registering and settling in on Thursday afternoon, the group loaded the busses for dinner. A pleasant surprise for those who had attended last year's conference in Williamsburg, VA came when we discovered that the Maryland All Stars had hired Blue Ridge Coach Line from Culpeper, VA to again provide conference transportation. Everyone was pleased to see Dave again and because of large participation numbers, we had a second Dave to drive us around!

Thursday's Amish style dinner was served at the Pleasant Valley Community Center followed by a presentation on maple syrup production. Friday morning, the group toured the Canal Place Museum and learned about the use of canal boats for early transportation in western Maryland. Then everyone boarded the train for a beautiful trip up the mountain. Some of the Virginia delegation had a particularly exciting tunnel experience during this journey. After departing the train, the group visited a reproduction 1830's village with shopping opportunities. This village is at the location of "The Little Crossings" used by George Washington and General Edward Braddock on their way to Fort Duquesne in Pittsburgh in 1755. The afternoon was complete with a visit to a dairy farm and corn maze. Dinner was served at the Garrett County Fairgrounds. Saturday began with a visit to the small town of Oakland with the chance to visit museums and shop at the annual sidewalk sale or the farmers market. A sudden downpour dampened the experience somewhat but it was great fun. Then it was back on the bus to travel to the Western Maryland 4-H Camp for lunch. A slight hitch was encountered when the bus drivers realized that the heavy rain had weighed down the tree branches along the narrow driveway to the 4-H camp and that they could not drive under them. The camp caretaker rode on the back of a pickup in front of the busses cutting tree limbs along the way. It seemed like we were on safari in the deep jungle. It was especially thrilling when one of the busses stopped for a long time on a low water bridge with the water rushing underneath. The extra time getting into the 4-H camp delayed the planned conference schedule. Using All Star flexibility, it was decided to skip a couple of the afternoon stops. Everyone agreed that after the previous bus trip, we probably didn't need to see the Forest Canopy Walkway. It was straight to the Wisp Resort Scenic Chair Lift. While enjoying the view from the chair lift up the mountain, participants could also witness the Extreme Sports Bike competition. Another rain storm caught several people at the top of the mountain causing some of the Virginia delegation to decide to walk down instead of waiting for an empty spot on the lift. After a quick stop in our rooms to change into dry clothes, it was back on the bus to the Fairgrounds for the final dinner and program. During the business meeting, the Big Chiefs of each state had to cast votes whether to continue annual conferences or change to every two years. By a three to two vote, it was decided to continue Annual Interstate Conferences. This means Virginia will host again in 2011.

Virginia received the Mary Cunningham Travel Plaque with a total of 3,489 miles. Maryland received the award for most First Time attendees but each First Time attendee received a small gift. Dick Angus of Maryland invited Virginia All Stars Sarah Gregory and Elwanda Luttrell into his Lodge of 1000. This is apparently a West Virginia and Maryland ritual that honors All Stars for outstanding service. West Virginia All Stars extended an invitation to the 2009 conference to be held in Huntington July 30 - August 2. Silent and live auctions raised \$1,929 for the Maryland 4-H Foundation. The conference ended Sunday morning with Vespers service which included commemoration of the deceased from all the states.

One day participants included Nancy Pence, Margaret Douglas, Sherry and Kara Jenkins.

The 9th IFYE World Conference was held October 4-11, 2008 in Adelaide, South Australia. Over 450 people from 22 different countries met together at the conference. The delegates were alumni of the International Four-H Youth Exchange and similar programs along with family members and supporters of the exchange programs. One hundred and forty of the participants were from the USA and ten either currently live or were from Virginia when they participated in their own exchange. Most of the participants from Virginia are Virginia 4-H All Stars.

The conference theme was "Many Cultures, One Country, One World" which refers to the broad multicultural diversity in Australia. It reflects the many cultures of the world and the continuing need for peace and understanding for one united world community. Highlights of the conference included a multi-faith church service parade of nations, multi-cultural dinners, and a one-day visit with host families. Delegates visited Cleland Wildlife Park, Mt. Lofty Summit and other local points of interest. Optional tours included a river cruise down the Murray River, a visit to Granite Island to see the "little penguins," or a winery tour. Workshops covered a range of topics from crafts with the County Women's Association, the Royal

Doctor Flying Service, and Aussie rules football. Thailand issued an invitation to the 10th IFYE World Conference to be held in 2013. The 2009 National Conference for the IFYE Association of the USA will be held in Indiana. Have you ever dreamed of travel and adventure? You can discover the world by participating in the International Four-H Youth Exchange programs. One of the following opportunities may be just what you need to broaden your horizons.

<u>IFYE Representative</u> – Participants between the ages of 19-30 years of age can experience life in another country first-hand through living with host families for three to six months. This is not the typical tourist's view of a foreign land, but a chance to participate in daily living and learn about the customs and culture of another country while sharing about your life in the United States.

<u>IFYE Ambassador</u> – For youth between the ages of 15-24, this program features a summer abroad (4-6 weeks) with individualized schedules. The purpose of the program is to assist youth in acquiring knowledge, developing skills, and forming attitudes that will help them become productive citizens of the global community. Approximately 35 countries have indicated their willingness to participate with U.S. delegates in 2009.

<u>IFYE Ambassador Groups</u> – Australia (ages 16-19), Finland (ages 15-19) and Costa Rica (ages 15-19) will be hosting groups of 4-H'ers from mid-June to mid-July of 2009. These groups will be accompanied by chaperones. In Australia, the group will visit Sydney and Melbourne and stay with host families in the state of Victoria. In Finland, the group will be hosted by the Finnish 4-H Federation. After orientation in Helsinki, the participants will stay with host families for 3 ½ weeks and then enjoy a group trip to Tallin, Estonia, before returning home. In Costa Rica, the Fundacion Nacional de Clubes 4S will play host, and participants will stay with host families, attend a 4S camp, and take a trip to the rain forest.

<u>Japan Outbound</u> – Youth between the ages of 12-19 with spend a month with a Japanese host family, with orientations in Seattle and Tokyo. A pre-program of four weeks is also an option, where students will stay with a family in the Tokyo area and attend classes in Japanese language and culture and attend a 4-day camp.

<u>Hosting</u> – Unable to travel at this time, or past the age range of the opportunities above? You can still participate by letting the world come to you. Host families are needed for periods of 2- to 4-weeks in summer and for the school year. Host families will receive advance information on the delegates and an orientation. This is a great chance for your family to experience a different language, a new culture, and a new way of looking at things both at home and overseas. Both urban and rural families are needed. Why not welcome an international visitor into your home?

The deadline to apply as an outbound delegate is February 1, but apply sooner to make certain that your first choice doesn't fill up. Host family applications are due by April 1.
