

- A. The State 4-H Staff may nominate a maximum of six (6) unit Extension staff and four (4) state or district Extension personnel for Honorary membership. These nominees shall have rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program for at least seven five years, two of which shall have been in Virginia.
- B. The unit membership committee may annually nominate three (3) adult volunteer leaders for honorary membership into the Virginia Chapter of 4-H All Stars. A maximum of eighteen (18) adult leaders may be inducted annually into membership. A nominee must have rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program for at least seven (7) five (5) years, two of which shall have been in Virginia.
- C. At any regular meeting, the Chapter may elect to Honorary Membership;
 - 1. Any person from a foreign country who has rendered outstanding service to 4-H or similar youth work in his/her country.
 - 2. Any representative from a donor organization who has rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program.
 - 3. Any person not otherwise eligible who has rendered outstanding service to the 4-H program.
- D. An affirmative two-thirds (2/3) vote of members present and voting is required for election to honorary membership. To be initiated to membership, said honorary nominee must attend a Consecration Ceremony.
- E. Honorary members may become active members by payment of dues as specified in Article II of the Bylaws, See Article I, Section 3B for definition of active membership,

Career wise, he has been a Therapeutic Mentor for DePaul Family Services, an assistant Volleyball Coach at Emory & Henry College, 4-H Camp Programming Staff, a Special Education Aide and Volleyball Coach at Virginia Intermont College and finally landed job in his chosen career as a 4-H Agent in Grayson County. After serving there for a few years, he has just recently transferred to his native Smyth County to be the 4-H Agent there. Tapped into the All Stars in 1999, this person has served as a scribe in his district chapter and also the state chapter. He works with his district All Stars who sponsor an annual teen weekend. The Greene County All Star is a sophomore at James Madison University and is majoring in Elementary Education.



Victoria Snyder was active in Consumerama, Leadership and Fashion Revue. She was a state competitor in 4-H Fashion Revue. She was club president, treasurer, teen council Vice President and President. She was a camp counselor for Jr. 4-H Camp and Fair Camp. She has volunteered with nursing homes, picked up garbage, rung bells for the Salvation Army, stuffed stockings for youth and volunteered with the Jaycee's Haunted House. After high school, Victoria went to college for just over 2 years studying Psychology and Social Work. She left college to be a wife and mother which led to volunteering with other organizations that include Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts. After running a home-based day care and home-school her own children, she returned to college and is now pursuing a degree in Nursing. Dottie Nelson, Bland 1974, was presented with the inaugural "Dottie Nelson Award for Excellence in 4-H International Programs" at the 2012 Midwinter Conference banquet. The Executive committee established the award to recognize initiative, growth, leadership and accomplishments in 4-H International programs by volunteer adult leaders. The purpose is to encourage volunteers to take leadership in programs with emphasis on opportunities which broaden the horizon of participants.

A similar award, the C. Dean Allen Award recognizes Extension Staff for their involvement in international programs and/or All Stars. As a 4-H volunteer, Dottie is seen as the face of 4-H related international programs in Virginia and the Executive Committee felt this was an appropriate honor for her extensive service.

In 2009 she was honored by the National Epsilon Sigma Phi organization as one of three volunteers selected as a national Friend of Extension award winner. The following excerpt does an excellent job of giving her credentials.

Dottie Nelson has been credited by 4-H agents and volunteer leaders with keeping the International 4-H Youth Exchange (IFYE) program alive and growing in

Virginia for more than 20 years. As its inbound and outbound coordinator, Nelson processes all program applications, purchases airline tickets, recruits host families throughout Virginia, plans and carries out orientation sessions, and ensures that participants have opportunities to take part in 4-H camps and State 4-H Congress, as well as to tour Washington D.C. She has worked with officials in numerous countries to place delegates, while serving at the national level as vice president and secretary of the IFYE Foundation and twice serving on the IFYE Association Board of Directors.

A native of Bland, Nelson also volunteers with the Virginia 4-H/Japanese and FLEX High School Exchange programs, the summer 4-H Japanese exchange program, ..."

In addition, in 2007 the All Stars honored Dottie with the Hall of Fame award. That presentation noted that she had held the offices of Big Chief, Lesser Chief and Recording Scribe as well as being Southwest District Chief, Lesser Chief, Scribe and Reporter. She also served as The Virginia Star Editor for eight years.
