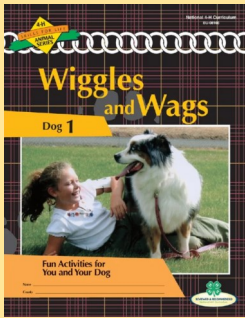




4-H Dog Projects Educational Clinic
