Project WET, Kari Abbott and Robbie Morrison - This water education master track will include hands-on experience with the activities of Project WET (Water Education for Teachers)! Project WET is an exciting water education program that promotes awareness, appreciation, knowledge and stewardship of water resources. All Project WET activities are hands-on, investigative, and easy-to-use.
