Vision Statement:

To support and retain Virginia adult 4-H volunteer leaders to strengthen the Virginia 4-H youth development program.

Mission Statement:

To educate and train 4-H adult volunteer leaders so that they can promote and provide support for the Virginia 4-H programs.

Goal Area 1: Promotion

Goal: To make known the purpose, benefits, and opportunities of VAA4HVL.

Objectives:

- 1. To increase the number of unit reps and alternatives to at least 40 by 2018.
- 2. To conduct at least one VAA4-HVL presentation to 4-H professionals per year.

Strategies:

- 1. VAA4-HVL will make presentations during 4-H Symposium and New 4-H Extension Agent training.
- 2. Develop and maintain an electronic listserv for the purpose of statewide volunteer communication utilizing 4HOnline and historical records from prior conferences.
- 3. Incorporate options into registration venues that will allow volunteers to list themselves as resources to other units. (Volunteer Speaker Bureau for judges, speakers, classes, teachers, camp volunteers)
- 4. During webpage redesign, place volunteer tab on top row for better visibility.
- 5. Update the webpage and resources with current information in various media that allows for distribution (mail or email).
- 6. Updated brochure for the VAA4-HVL Association.
- 7. Include senior 4-H members as a marketing strategy to increase membership after aging out of the 4-H program.
- 8. Develop a social media marketing plan.

Goal Area 2: Resources

Goal: The VAA4HVL will be the premiere organization to provide support and training for Virginia Adult 4-H Volunteers.

Objectives:

- 1. Review existing needs assessment of 4-H volunteer leaders to provide relevant training.
- 2. Offer diverse training opportunities based on the needs of volunteers (variety of projects, in-depth learning experiences).

Strategies:

- 1. Offer Continue Education Units and master track training opportunities
- Create a membership list and database that lists project areas for the VAA4HVL. List of
 volunteers and specialization and/or interests to create a database of volunteer
 resources (speakers bureau). Ask the Expert volunteer edition.
- 3. Assess the Virginia Cooperative Extension 4-H faculty/staff perception of the value of volunteers.

Goal Area 3: Financial Resource Development

Goal: The Virginia Association of Adult 4-H Volunteer Leaders will achieve financial stability by 2018.

Objectives:

- 1. Development of a balanced annual budget.
- 2. Development of a resource development plan.

Strategies:

- 1. Establish an endowment in the Virginia 4-H Foundation to create annual income.
- 2. On an annual basis, establish a network of sponsors to support the development of VAA4-HVL.
- 3. Establish a diverse fundraising plan to include expanded auction opportunities (tea cup, silent, and live auctions).
