Block & Bridle 2023 Hippology Contest Rules & Resources February 10, 2023

OBJECTIVE

The primary objective of the Hippology contest is to provide, in a friendly but competitive setting, an opportunity for youth enrolled in 4-H or FFA to demonstrate the breadth of their knowledge and understanding of equine science and management, and in particular, the practical application of this knowledge and skill. It is hoped that this contest will generate new friendships and be a rewarding experience for the contestants.

Guidelines and Essentials – Please Read Carefully – Contest protocol, eligibility and content are included in this letter. Please take time to thoroughly read as most, if not all, questions are answered in this information.

Any regulations or protocol, with regards to health and social distancing, in place at the time of the event will be communicated to the coaches or all registered participants. There are currently no restrictions in place.

Late entries will **NOT** be accepted.

Entry Fee Payments are NOT to be mailed, but submitted the DAY OF THE EVENT during registration and check-in. Invoices will be created and emailed to the coach upon acceptance of entries. Entry fees are due and payable for the number of youth ENTERED, not the number who participate. Entry fees for the Hippology Contest are \$8.00/contestant.

Team Designation is not required at the time of entry – Team assignments will be made by the coach during registration/check-in the day of the event.

During the entry process you will need the following information for each contestant: Name, Date of Birth, Current Grade Level (required for FFA contestants), and any accommodations required.

<u>There are NOT separate 4-H and FFA Contests, therefore youth may NOT dual enter</u>. Each participant must decide whether they will compete representing FFA or 4-H. All contestants must be an enrolled and eligible member of the FFA Chapter or 4-H Unit that they represent in the contest.

Teams consist of three or four members. In teams in which there are four members, all will compete, but the member receiving the lowest overall score will be automatically declared the alternate. The scores of the alternate will not be included in any of the team totals, but will be eligible for individual awards. Teams consisting of three members will have no alternate and all members' scores will count in determining team awards.

Team members must all represent the same Unit or FFA Chapter and be enrolled members of that organization. ***Composite teams will not be created for the 2023 Contest*** Individuals who are not members of a team are still eligible for individual awards.

Contestants participating as individuals only will not complete the team problem.

Eligibility rules respective to each youth organization are enforced:

FFA –Eligibility of teams will be determined by the rules stated in the National FFA Career Development Event Manual as well as "Official Board Policy".

<u>Senior teams</u> – members must be in 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade at the time of the contest. <u>Junior Teams</u> – members must be in 6th, 7th, 8th, or 9th grade at the time of the contest. ***9th grade contestants may only compete in one division.

4-H – <u>Senior Division</u> – members must turn 14 years of age before January 1, 2023 and not have had their 19th birthday before January 1, 2023.

<u>Junior Division</u> – members will not have had their 14th birthday before January 1, 2023. Youth who will be 9 years old by September 30, 2023 are eligible to compete.

***All senior contestants must be eligible for their respective organization's National Hippology CDE or Contest, having not previously participated in that event.

***Please Note: This is the last year that grade level will be used to determine eligibility and age divisions for FFA Youth. <u>Beginning with the 2024 Contest</u>, birthdate and age as of January 1 will be used to determine age divisions for ALL participants.

THE CONTEST

A. **Examination Phase**-This phase of the contest will include a written exam

B. **Slide Phase-** This phase of the contest will include PowerPoint slides consisting of multiple-choice questions identifying or using pictures

C. **Station Phase**- This phase will consist of a series of stations or tables where at each, all contestants will respond to the requirements of the station. Examples of stations which may be used include:

1. Identification of:

a. Various types of saddles (actual or pictured) and parts of saddles

b. Tack, bits, bridles, horseshoes, and parts of shoes.

c. Tools and Equipment, and assembly of specific parts of various pieces of equipment.

d. Grains and forages used in equine rations including various forms and methods of preparation

e. Internal and external parasites based on actual samples, pictures, life cycle chart and/or damage caused

f. Blemishes and unsoundnesses

- g. Ages of equines based on teeth
- 2. Use of pulse rate, respiration rate, temperature, dehydration, anemia, etc. to assess horse health.

3. Measurements such as, but not limited to, wither height, shoe size, girth, collar size, gullet width, seat length of saddle, etc. may be required.

D. **Judging** - Contestants will be required to place one or two conformation classes – these may be live classes or picture classes.

E. **Team Problem** - All teams within an age division will be presented with the same problem. Each team will have equal time to discuss among themselves the problem, and <u>provide the required answers on the Scantron</u> <u>of the "-1" team member.</u> Topics, and associated questions, that could be covered in the team problem may include the following:

1. Balancing a horse's ration.

2. Farm management recommendation for specific, (i.e., breeding, training, boarding, nursery, lay-up, etc) horse operations.

3. Considerations for the establishment of a new horse facility (stable to be used for a specific purpose).

4. Recommendations for selecting, locating and purchasing horses for specific uses.

5. Behavior problems-causes, management of and corrections.

6. Training & conditioning programs: equipment, schedules, methods, nutrition, problem avoidance.

7. Breeding and/or leasing contracts-specific clauses for insurance, liability, payments, care, termination, transport, etc.

8. Teaching lessons in horse management (specific subject to be announced) to a group of Beginner horse riders including how much time, topics to cover, etc.

9. Explanation of use or assembly of specific equipment will be considered.

10. Demonstrate skill or ability to use specific equipment.

Team problem scores will not be included in determining the rank of individuals in the contest, but will be added to the team scores of the other three phases to determine overall team standing for each division.

this form prior to the contest. Each contestant will need a clipboard and at least one No.2 pencil to complete the scantron.

AWARDS – Junior and Senior divisions

1. Individual awards are given within Junior and Senior divisions, respectfully. Three awards categories for the top 10 individuals will include: (1) examination & slide phase scores combined; (2) stations & judging scores combined; and (3) overall total score.

2. Team awards are given within Junior and Senior divisions, respectfully. The top five teams will be recognized for scores in (1) examination & slide phase scores combined; (2) stations & judging scores combined; (3) team problem; and (4) overall total score.

Tie Breaking

All ties overall, individual and team, will be broken using the following sequence:

- 1. Examination scores
- 2. Station scores
- 3. Judging scores

Ties within any phase are to be broken using the overall score first and then the same sequence as above. If further tie breaking is needed, the scores at each station, in order may be used.

THE CONTEST

Scoring: Scoring is based on the Hormel Computing System, with 50 points being a perfect score on a class placing or on a set of oral reasons. All classes will consist of four horses. Halter classes will be lined up head to tail and numbered 1-2-3-4 beginning with the rear horse. Riders of performance horses will wear the horse's number (1,2,3,4). Fifteen minutes will be allowed for each class placing. The three high scores will be added together for the team score. All team members will be eligible for individual awards.

Recording Placings: Contestants will use a Scantron to record their placings.

<u>https://www.judgingcard.com/ScanSheets/samples/705A-12.pdf</u> is the link for the scantron that will be utilized. Please familiarize all contestants with this form. Each contestant will need at least one #2 pencil and a standard clipboard for recording their answers.

Soundness: All halter horses are to be judged as sound of limb, eye, mouth, wind, and reproductive status. All performance horses will be judged as they go unless otherwise stated by contest officials. Legality of tack, equipment, and rider dress will be confirmed prior to the class.

Classes: Contestants will judge 6 to 10 classes. Classes will be announced at the contest and selected from, but not limited to, the following list:

Halter: Hunter in Hand, Stock Horse, Pony of America, Tennessee Walking Horse or Gaited Type, Arabian/Half Arabian, Thoroughbred, American Saddlebred, Pony Halter, Morgan, Sport Horse, Draft Horse, Mules Performance: Western Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle, English Pleasure, Hunter Hack, Plantation Pleasure, Country Pleasure, Reining, Western Riding, Racking Horse, Hunt Seat Equitation, Western Horsemanship, Trail, Ranch Riding, Saddle Seat Equitation

Judging classes will be generally scored and conducted according to the rules of the USEF and AQHA. Breed classes will be judged according to the respective breed standards.

Contest Etiquette:

1. Contestants are not permitted to carry cell phones or any other electronic devices at any time during the contest.

2. Contestant dress code. Cold weather is the norm for Blacksburg in February and warm layers are recommended for everyone. No hats are allowed during the judging competition. During the reasons competition, contestants are expected to dress neatly and professionally but expensive clothing and horse show outfits are not necessary. Boots or closed toe shoes are appropriate for the halter judging section of the contest. With proper planning, there is little need for a full wardrobe change when time is more appropriately spent preparing reasons.

3. Contestants must not confer during the contest, including oral reasons preparation. Contestants must supply their own note pads, clip boards, and pencils. Contestants may not take any printed materials into the contest other than notes they prepare during the contest and patterns provided to all contestants. Placing cards will not be returned. There will be some heat, but again, warm clothing is recommended.

4. The reasons competition is designed to reward excellence in accuracy and oral delivery of the pertinent information. Contestants are strongly urged to not use their notes during the delivery of reasons. Reason scores will incur a 25-point penalty if read by the contestant, without regard to content. NOTE: Judges will be empathetic to contestants, especially those who are in the initial learning stages. They will be encouraging and understanding. This event is intended to be a practice contest for learning.

Please read through the instructions, make sure you have the information needed and available before you begin.

Prior to beginning:

- Identify <u>all</u> potential youth that will be participating from your Unit, Club or Chapter
 - Only youth who are pre-entered and verified as eligible and enrolled 4-H or FFA members qualify to participate
- For each youth you wish to enter, you will need the following information:
 - Contestant Name
 - \circ 4-H or FFA (which organization are they competing under)
 - FULL Date of Birth this will be used to assign 4-H youth to age division

- Enter Coach Information please provide a complete address, phone number and email address
- Enter the total number of youth you plan to bring to the event(s)
 - This is across all contests covered by that entry link
 - This number is what tells the form how many "Contestant Information" fields to generate for you to complete
- Enter the number of youth you plan to bring to each contest next to the respective contest line

- Don't forget to click the final next arrow at the bottom of your Response Summary page this is what submits your entry.
- Your entry has not been submitted until you see the "Your response has been recorded" box at the end of the survey.
