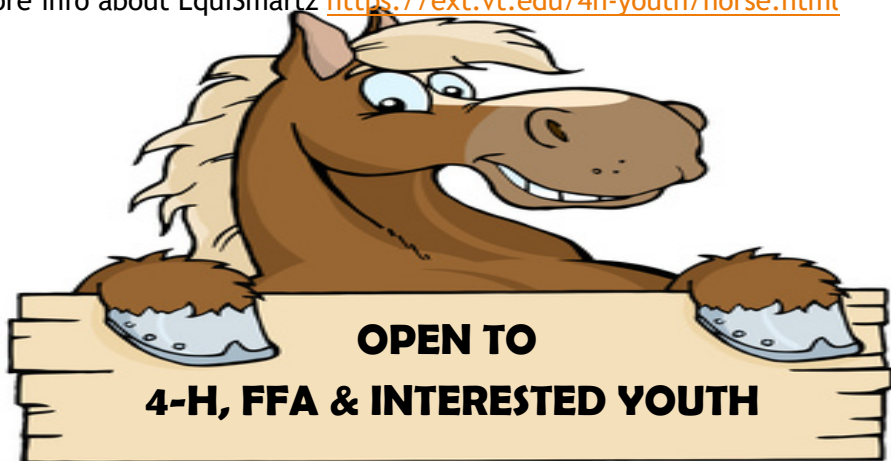




An introductory program, 4-H members and interested youth from the **Northeast 4-H District** and surrounding Counties are invited to come and experience components of the state educational contests collectively known as EquiSmartz. This clinic includes sessions in Horse Bowl, Hippology, and Horse Judging. Youth will learn the basic format of the contests and types of questions presented, plus participate in a mini-practice contest for each component (no awards). Club leaders, parents, and volunteers participate in a concurrent session for instruction on how to organize teams for EquiSmartz and to share ideas. *Youth must have a designated adult chaperone on site. Live horse judging will be at Greenfield Farm, 11218 Cross Corner Rd, Ashland, VA for afternoon session. All attendees must provide their own transportation.*
