The following individuals <u>will be required</u> to pass Horsemanship Skills levels 1&2 in order to be eligible for the 2016 State 4-H Championship Horse & Pony Show:

- All <u>under-saddle</u> horse/rider combinations who have not previously attended the State 4-H Championship Horse & Pony Show. This includes:
  - o 4-H Members who have not previously attended the state show

- 4-H Members who *have* previously shown at the state level, but not with their current project horse.
- \*\*Please note: In the case of a substitution, the substituted horse must have also previously attended the state horse show or have already passed Horsemanship Skills levels 1&2 with that rider in order to be eligible for substitution.

## Following are the minimum requirements that must be met to be considered to host a 4H Horsemanship Skills Evaluation:

- The evaluation must focus and provide testing on Skill Level 1 and Skill Level II. All 4-H
  members must complete these before testing can be considered for Skill Level III and Skill
  Level IV.
- 2. The evaluation must provide the opportunity for each rider and horse a safe contained area for the horse to be turned out with no halter.
- 3. The evaluation may include an opportunity for 4-H members to have their horses officially measured.
- 4. The evaluation must provide participants with feedback in the form of the official Horsemanship Skills Evaluation sheet. Sample evaluation sheets can be found on the State 4-H Horse Program website.
- 5. Event coordinators **MUST** send a completed form for evaluated riders electronically to Leona Ransdell at <u>leonar@vt.edu</u> within two (2) weeks following the event. <u>If this form is not received, youth are not eligible for the State 4-H Horse Show!</u> This form is available online on the State 4-H Horse Program website.
- 6. Evaluations must follow all VCE and VA 4-H Horse Program policies.
- 7. Evaluations must have signed equine waivers from all participants, evaluators, and helpers (adults and youth).
- 8. Applications for hosting 4-H Horsemanship Skills Evaluations will be posted on the State 4-H Horse website.
  - a. These forms must be completed and forwarded to your District Horse Council for evaluation approval.
  - b. Approved evaluation information will be sent to Leona Ransdell at <a href="mailto:leonar@vt.edu">leonar@vt.edu</a> by the evaluation organizer so that it can be added to the 4-H Horse Program calendar.
- Official Horsemanship Skills Evaluation forms must be ordered from your District Horse Council or the State 4-H Horse Program office at least one week prior to the evaluation date.
- 10. The cost of a Horsemanship Skills Evaluation to participating 4-H members should be determined by district horse councils as needed to cover expenses.
- 11. Two trained Horsemanship Skills Evaluators must be on-site for all evaluations.
- 12. Once completed, official Horsemanship Skills Evaluation forms should be distributed in the following order:
  - a. Evaluators should keep the first copy (white)
  - b. 4-H Members should keep the second copy (yellow)
  - c. Extension agents should be sent the third copy (pink)
  - d. 4-H Leaders should keep the fourth copy (gold)

All Horsemanship Skills Evaluations <u>must</u> be hosted prior to the State 4-H Horse Show entry deadline.
