Virginia 4-H Horsemanship Skills Program Level 3 & 4 Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the purpose of levels 3 & 4?

- **a.** Both level 3 and 4 were designed to be more advanced.
- **b.** Level 3 is designed to assess the knowledge of the youth being tested on various topics of equine.
 - i. 50 question written test
 - **ii.** Practical which will include 9 stations that will include live horses and equipment.
- **c.** Level 4 is designed to assess the youth being tested on advanced riding skills for their specific discipline.

2. Who can be tested on levels 3 & 4?

- **a.** Any **SENIOR** who has successfully completed and passed levels 1 and 2.
- **b.** You must pass level 3 to move on to level 4.

3. Are levels 3 & 4 required to show at the state level?

a. No. These are advanced levels and are offered as an optional opportunity to advance in the Virginia 4-H Horsemanship skills program.

4. What happens once youth have passed levels 3 & 4?

- **a.** The youth never have to test any horsemanship skills level again on any new horse.
- **b.** The youth will receive a certificate of completion and a professional letter congratulating them on this accomplishment.

5. Where can I be tested on levels 3 and 4?

- **a.** Both levels will be offered at the State Show.
- **b.** Level 3 will have an additional testing date in the spring of each year.

6. Who will evaluate levels 3 and 4?

- **a.** Level 3 will be evaluated by industry professionals and appointed state 4-H volunteers.
- **b.** Level 4 will be evaluated by our state horse show judges in each discipline.

7. Do I need a horse for level 3 and 4?

- **a.** No. Horses will be provided at each level 3 testing date.
- **b.** You will use your own horse for level 4 at the state show.

8. <u>If a rider does not complete a full level on their first attempt, do they have to be retested on the entire level or can they just retest the skills they missed?</u>

a. The rider will have to be retested on the entire level.

9. Can I become a level 3 and 4 trained evaluator?

- a. No.
- **b.** Level 3 evaluators will be industry professionals and appointed volunteers.
- **c.** Level 4 will only be the state show judges.

10. Can I host a level 3 and 4 evaluation?

a. No. Level 4 will only be available at the state show. Level 3 will be offered at the state show and one other time.

Additional things to keep in mind

- 1. The skill levels of the Horsemanship Skills Program are progressive in nature. Consequently, a rider cannot attempt level four until they have passed level three.
- 2. Trained evaluators for level 1 and 2 are not eligible to evaluate level 3.
- 3. No spectators will be allowed for level 3.
- 4. Spectators will be allowed to watch from a distance for level 4.
- 5. Level 3 participants need to follow the State horse show dress code for their appropriate attire for their discipline.
- 6. Appropriate show attire for your discipline is required for level 4.
- *** 2018 is a pilot year for Levels 3 and 4. Small numbers of youth will be accepted at each testing.
- *** October 1, 2018 all horsemanship skills exemptions and grandfather rules will be void. Every youth will have to pass levels 1 and 2 for each new horse. Once they pass levels 3 and 4 they will no longer have to test levels 1 and 2 for any new horse.
