The following individuals <u>will be required</u> to pass Horsemanship Skills levels 1&2 in order to be eligible for the State 4-H Championship Horse & Pony Show:

- All riders/drivers who have not previously attended the State 4-H Championship Horse & Pony Show.
- 4-H members only doing showmanship and/or minis in hand at State only need to pass Level 1.

Following are the minimum requirements that must be met to be considered to host a 4-H Horsemanship Skills Evaluation:

- 1. The evaluation must focus and provide testing on Skill Level 1 and Skill Level II. All 4-H members must complete these before testing can be considered for Skill Level III and Skill Level IV.
- 2. The evaluation must provide the opportunity for each rider and horse a safe contained area for the horse to be turned out with no halter.
- 3. The evaluation may include an opportunity for 4-H members to have their horses officially measured.
- 4. The evaluation must provide participants with feedback in the form of the official Horsemanship Skills Evaluation sheet. Test sheets can be found on the State 4-H Horse Program website.
- 5. Event coordinators MUST send a completed form for evaluated riders electronically to Sandy Arnold at horse4h@vt.edu within two (2) weeks following the event. <u>If this form is</u> <u>not received</u>, <u>youth are not eligible for the State 4-H Horse Show!</u> This form is available online on the State 4-H Horse Program website.
- 6. Evaluations must follow all VCE and VA 4-H Horse Program policies.
- 7. Evaluations must have signed equine waivers from all participants, evaluators, and helpers (adults and youth).
- 8. Applications for hosting 4-H Horsemanship Skills Evaluations will be posted on the State 4-H Horse website.
 - a. These forms must be completed and forwarded to your District Horse Council for evaluation approval.
 - b. Approved evaluation information will be sent to Sandy Arnold at horse4h@vt.edu by the evaluation organizer so that it can be added to the 4-H Horse Program calendar.
- 9. Official Horsemanship Skills Evaluation forms must be ordered from your District Horse Council or the State 4-H Horse Program office <u>at least one week prior to the evaluation date.</u>
- 10. The cost of a Horsemanship Skills Evaluation to participating 4-H members should be determined by district horse councils as needed to cover expenses.
- 11. Two trained Horsemanship Skills Evaluators must be on-site for all evaluations.
- 12. Once completed, official Horsemanship Skills Evaluation signed copies should be provided to the following:
 - a. Evaluators
 - b. 4-H Members
 - c. 4-H Member's Extension agent
 - d. 4-H Member's Club Leaders

All Horsemanship Skills Evaluations <u>must</u> be hosted prior to the State 4-H Horse Show entry deadline.
