## 2021 Horsemanship Skills Qualifying Rules for State 4-H Horse Show

## For 2021 ONLY, the following two options are available for Horsemanship Skills.

- <u>1.</u> It is preferred and encouraged that if at all possible, Horsemanship Skills should happen inperson at a scheduled event. Please check with your District Horse Council for dates available and check the Horse Program PDF Calendar regularly. See the Horsemanship Skills Evaluation Forms and FAQs for more information.
- 2. <u>Video submissions</u> will also be accepted. The deadline for video submission is July 12, 2021.

Please note all other State Show requirements remain in place.

## VIDEO SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

This video submission is only valid for the 2021 State 4-H Horse Show and does not mean a Horse/Rider pair has passed Horsemanship Skills for future shows. Horse/Rider combinations will still be required to take and pass Horsemanship Skills for future shows.

To submit a video, please follow these requirements:

- 1. At the beginning of each video, please introduce yourself and state the following:
  - a. Name
  - b. Unit/County
  - c. 4-H Club name
  - d. Horse Name (show and barn or nick name)
- 2. If submitting for Level 1, demonstrate basic safety skills required without making a lengthy video. Minor video breaks will be allowed. Use the Level 1 Evaluation Form to check off skills demonstrated in your video.
- 3. Level 2 video once mounted, the video must be continuous, no editing, no breaks. If the evaluator suspects your video has been edited, you will be asked to submit the video again.
  - a. Use the <u>Level 2 Evaluation Form</u> to check off ALL OF THESE skills demonstrated in your video.
  - b. Be sure to demonstrate *ALL in Level 2* including:
    - mounting safely
    - all gaits in both directions
    - halt from trot and a halt from canter
    - figure 8 at both trot and canter
    - simple lead change shown in both directions
    - dismount

## Who needs to be tested?

**A. Junior Members:** All junior youth must take and pass Levels 1 and 2 with any new horse that they have not previously taken or passed Horsemanship Skills with.

**B. Senior Members:** Seniors who have previously taken and passed Levels 1 and 2 must now test and pass only Level 2 (with proficiency shown in the Level 1 Skills) with ANY new horse that has not been shown with THAT RIDER at the State Horse Show or State Fair. Horse/Rider combinations that have previously shown at the State Show or State fair do not have to re-test if that horse/rider combination is not changing.
