Notes for Parents or Helpers: A parent or helper may want to serve as a judge to help the learner understand the Quarter System. It would be helpful for an adult to set up the practice pattern and assistance will be needed to record the practice pattern. An adult should always be present when youth are working with equines.



Muzzle, Ears, Legs, Bridle Path, and Under the Jaw

Description of Arm Position

Should hang naturally from shoulders, forming an "L" Elbows against your sides, not rigid Hands and wrists straight with thumbs on top.
