entry deadline is *March* 14. The Virginia Horse Festival schedule is online now so encourage friends and family to come experience a weekend of fantastic horse education and entertainment!

Horsemanship Skills 3&4 is in the works! Here is what you need to know. First, it is not required! The only Horsemanship Skills that are required to participate in District Shows and the State Show are Levels 1&2. Horsemanship Skills 3&4 are designed for those who want to go above and beyond the minimum requirements and accomplish a higher degree of horse knowledge and skills. The testing will be open to Senior Level 4-H members. We hope to have the testing ready for the 2016 State Show. Level 3 will be an advanced knowledge and skills based test. Some skills that could be tested include taking TPR, leg wrapping, advanced showmanship and horse care. Only upon passing Level 3 will 4-Hers be able to move on to Level 4. Testing will be discipline specific by their respective judges at the State Show for Level 4. Special awards will be presented to those who complete Levels 3 & 4. We hope that Senior 4-Hers will be excited and ready to take on this new achievement challenge. More information will be forthcoming as the committee continues to formulate plans.
