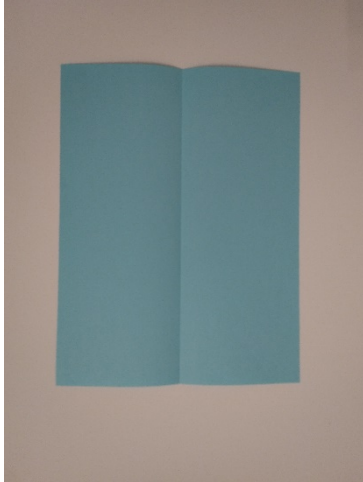




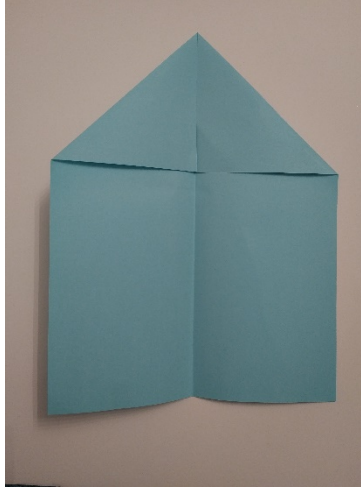

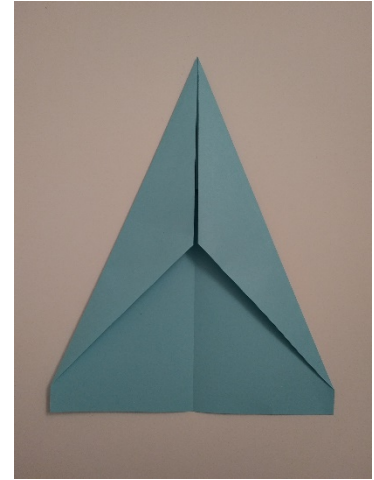
Folding a Paper Airplane 1



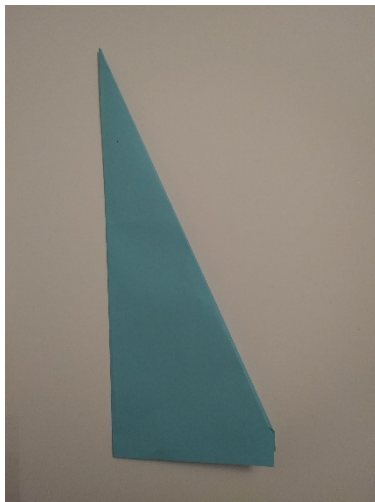
Fold paper in half to crease; then unfold.



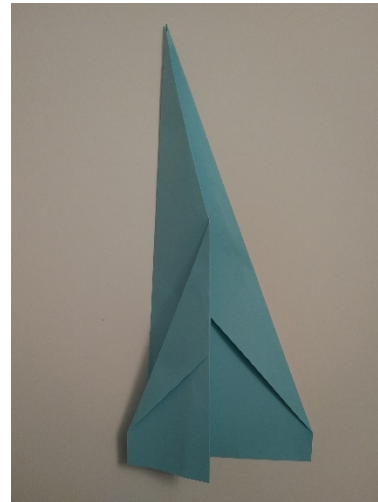
Fold top corners down to center crease.



Fold the top corners down again to center crease.



Fold paper in half toward center crease.



Fold one wing outward, to meet the bottom edge of the plane's body.
