What is 4-H? 4-H is a community of young people across America who are learning **leadership, citizenship, and life skills.**



4-H Mission: Engaging youth to reach their fullest potential while advancing the field of youth development.



4-H Enrollment

188,563 members

- 51% females
- 49% males
- 47% minority enrollment



4-H Adult & Teen Volunteers

14,900 volunteers



Where 4-H Members Live:

- 4% Farms
- 41% Towns and Rural Areas of 10,000 or less population
- 21% Towns and Cities of 10,000-50,000 population
- 34% Suburbs and Cities of 50,000 or more population



Age of 4-H Members: (Does not add up to 100% due to special and not in school members)

- 37% Cloverbud (5-8 years of age)
- 40% Juniors (9-11 years of age)
- 12% Intermediates (12-13 years of age)
- 10% Seniors (14-19 years of age)
