RE: 2019 Block & Bridle Club Livestock Judging, Meat Judging, and Stockmen's Contests

The Bridle Club at Virginia Tech Block has scheduled their 2019 stockmen's and livestock judging contests for March 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, respectively. The meat judging contest had been moved to separate weekend and will be held on March 16<sup>th</sup>. These contests will be held on the Virginia Tech campus in Blacksburg with the livestock judging and stockmen's contests held in Alphin-Stuart Arena and the Livestock Judging Pavilion and the meat judging contest held in the Meat Science Center and Litton-Reaves Hall. There have been several changes to the contest schedule, scoring, and entry forms this year, so <u>please read all parts carefully</u>. A detailed schedule with contest starting times and locations can be found on page 6.

Starting in 2019, the Block and Bridle Club is allowing teams from outside of Virginia to compete. There

is no limit to the number of teams a county or chapter can enter in any contest. There is a junior and senior advanced livestock judging contest (contestants give reasons) that is scored differently from the junior and senior livestock judging contests that do not have contestants give reasons, so please enter your teams and individuals in the appropriate contest.

All contestants must be enrolled in either the 4-H county unit or FFA chapter that they represent in these contests. Multi-county or unit teams will only be considered eligible if only one of the units represented by that team has a viable program in that contest area. It is expected that contestants competing on multi-county or unit teams regularly practice together.

The entry fee is \$6 per individual in every contest. The entry fee for individuals competing in the advanced divisions of the livestock judging contest is \$11 because lunch is served during the contest. Stockmen's and livestock judging entries must be postmarked by February 14<sup>th</sup> to avoid a late fee. Entries postmarked from February 15<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup> are \$12 per contestant (\$17 for advanced livestock judging). Entries postmarked after February 21<sup>st</sup> will not be accepted. No entries will be accepted on the day of the contest, but substitutions can be made.

Meat judging entries must be postmarked by <u>March 1<sup>st</sup></u> to avoid a late fee. Entries postmarked from <u>March 2<sup>nd</sup> – 7<sup>th</sup></u> are \$12 per contestant. Entries postmarked after March 8<sup>th</sup> will not be accepted. No entries will be



accepted on the day of the contest, but substitutions can be made.

<u>Stockmen's Contest</u> – The stockmen's contest is a test of general knowledge of livestock production.

Contest format is similar to the state stockmen's contest. The 15-minute classes include a 20 - 25 question multiple choice quiz (100 points); identification of feeds, equipment, breeds, and retail meat cuts (50 points each class); judging of hay, retail meat cuts, and classes of live animals (50 points each class); and questions about judging classes (25 points each class). It is possible the contest may feature a data scenario with pictures and performance data (50 points) in place of a judging class of live animals. There will be a group exercise for senior teams that members will complete together. Please be aware that we will have a nutritive analysis and scenario on the hay judging for senior contestants, separate junior and senior classes for both hay and meat, and separate sets of breeds, feeds, and equipment for junior and senior. Contestants are welcome to bring simple 4-function calculators for the team problem.

Members who have previously participated in the National 4-H Skillathon contest are <u>not</u> eligible to participate in this contest. The contest will be held Friday, March 1<sup>st</sup>. Contest divisions and contestant eligibility are detailed in the summary table.

Contestant Responses: A change for 2019 is that the senior stockmen's contest will be scored using a Scantron sheet from judgingcard.com. We will be using the horticulture CDE Scantron form that can be found at: <a href="https://www.judgingcard.com/ScanSheets/samples/482.pdf">https://www.judgingcard.com/ScanSheets/samples/482.pdf</a>. Please familiarize your contestants with this form so before the contest. The quiz in the junior contest will be scored using a simple Scantron sheet, but all our parts of the contest will be scored using paper cards.

<u>Livestock Judging Contest</u> – This contest will consist of eight to ten classes of beef cattle, swine, sheep, and meat goats. Performance data may be provided for at least one breeding class in each species. Ten questions will be asked on 2 classes. It will be possible to have breeding or market classes of each species. Market lambs will be handled in racks by all contestants. Meat goats could be used for either a reasons or questions class.

The contest will be broken into four divisions: junior livestock judging contest, senior livestock judging contest, junior advanced livestock judging contest and senior advanced livestock judging contest. Contestants 13 years and younger as of January 1, 2019 (4-H) or 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, or 9<sup>th</sup> grades (FFA) who are not giving reasons will compete in the junior division. All contestants 14 to 18 as of January 1, 2019 or 9<sup>th</sup> grade or later (FFA) who do not give reasons will compete in the senior division. All contestants who give reasons will be in the junior advanced (2 sets of reasons) and senior advanced (4 sets of reasons) divisions based on the previously stated age breaks.

Members who have previously participated in the National 4-H Livestock Judging contest or National

Livestock Evaluation CDE are  $\underline{not}$  eligible to participate under that organization in this contest. The contest will be held Saturday, March  $2^{nd}$ .

**Contestant Responses:** A change for 2019 is that the senior livestock judging and senior advanced livestock judging contests will be scored using a Scantron sheet from judgingcard.com. We will be using the livestock judging Scantron form that can be found at: <a href="https://www.judgingcard.com/ScanSheets/samples/476-3.pdf">https://www.judgingcard.com/ScanSheets/samples/476-3.pdf</a>. Please familiarize your contestants with this form so before the contest. The junior and junior advanced contests will be scored using traditional judging and questions cards.

<u>Meat Judging Contest</u> – The contest will be held Saturday, March 16<sup>th</sup>. This will be the Virginia state contest for 4-H and FFA members. The contest will be broken into separate 4-H and FFA divisions.

Quiz material will come from the Meat Science and Food Safety Microsoft PowerPoint found at: <a href="http://www.cevmultimedia.com/index.php?p=product&id=1595">http://www.cevmultimedia.com/index.php?p=product&id=1595</a>. Please be aware that you must order the PowerPoint from CEV and the cost is \$125.00.

Contestant Responses: FFA and 4-H will use their respective organization's Identification Key and Score Sheet. Contestants will complete a Scantron form for all responses to the meat judging contest. This includes quiz, placings for judging classes, answers to questions, and all the additional classes that are only in the FFA contest. Please familiarize your contestants with this form. To maintain cleanliness of the Scantron forms, contestants will be given a form resembling the Scantron form to complete while in the

meats lab. Contestants will be given adequate time to transfer their responses to the Scantron after exiting the meats lab.

Beef grading for this contest may be from a description of carcass characteristics provided. Beef carcasses may not be available.

The National FFA Meat Evaluation and Technology CDE employs a <u>three person team</u> format with no drop score, instead of a four person team, and therefore our state FFA meat judging contest will follow that system.

Classes in the judging portion of the contest can come from the following, but are not limited to:
