RE: 2023 Block & Bridle Club Stockmen's, Livestock Judging, and Meat Evaluation Contests

The Block & Bridle Club at Virginia Tech has scheduled their 2023 Stockmen's and Livestock Judging contests for Friday, February 23rd and Saturday, February 24th, respectively. The Meat Judging contests will be held the following Saturday on March 2nd. These contests will be held on the Virginia Tech campus in Blacksburg with the livestock judging and stockmen's contests held in the Alphin-Stuart Arena. The meat judging contest will be held in the Meat Science Center and Litton-Reaves Hall.

Please take time to completely and thoroughly read this letter, which includes rules, eligibility requirements, and contest content. While we gladly welcome your questions, most of the questions we receive are already answered in the information that follows. A detailed schedule with contest starting times and locations can be found on the last page of this letter. *****Please note: age divisions and/or contest divisions are being held at different times to accommodate participant numbers and alleviate the need to limit the number of teams/contestants that a Unit, Club, or Chapter can enter.**

There is no limit to the number of teams a unit, club, or chapter can enter in any contest. For Stockmen's and Livestock Judging there are NOT separate 4-H and FFA contests; participants will need to choose whether they compete as an FFA member or a 4-H member – they are not allowed to compete for both organizations. There are not separate awards or recognitions for 4-H versus FFA in the Stockman's and Livestock Judging Contests.

Please see information specific to the Meats evaluation contest for details on dual entry in that event. Out-ofstate teams and individuals are invited and allowed to compete in all three contests.

All Contests - <u>Contestant Eligibility</u>: All contestants must be enrolled in either the 4-H unit or FFA chapter that they represent in these contests. There are no exceptions, and enrollment will be verified using 4HOnline and the State FFA enrollment records for all contestants.

Entry Fees - The entry fee is \$10 per individual in all divisions of the Stockmen's Contest and the Regular (nonreasons) divisions of the Livestock Judging Contest. Individuals competing in the Advanced divisions of the Livestock Judging contest will pay a \$15.00/person entry fee – this includes lunch for those contestants. Meats contestants who are only entering in the 4-H OR FFA contest will pay an entry fee of \$15/person and those contestants Dual-Entering as both 4-H AND FFA will pay \$20/person to cover the cost of additional awards and resources. <u>All entries are due no later than Friday, February 16th</u> Late entries will not be accepted. Entry fees should be paid on the day of the contest and will be assessed based on the number of youth ENTERED in the entry system. Please do NOT submit payment when mailing your entry forms. Payment should be brought the



day of the contests. Invoices for the amount due, based on the number ENTERED, will be generated and emailed upon acceptance of entries. Acceptable forms of payment are:

All livestock contest entries – Stockman's, Judging, and Meats Evaluation - will be submitted on one form using the link above.

Directions for how to complete the entry form(s) and what information you will need to provide are included at the beginning of the form, and in the separately attached Entry Form Tip Sheet.

All contests and all contestant information will be submitted at this one link. Please have the following information available for each contestant prior to beginning the entry process:

- Name
- Date of Birth
- Any special dietary restrictions
- Any Assistive Services Requested (reader, interpreter, etc.)

You will only need to know how many contestants you plan to enter for each contest and the required identifying information for each child as listed above. Youth will not be assigned to teams during the entry process. That information will be provided during check-in. Please pre-enter all youth that want to participate. Only pre-entered youth that have been verified as enrolled and eligible will be allowed to participate in the contests.

NEW FOR 2024 – <u>Stockman's and Livestock Judging</u> (Not Meats Evaluation): ALL AGE DIVISIONS WILL BE BROKEN AND DETERMINED BASED ON BIRTH DATE (NOT GRADE LEVEL) Contestants 13 years and younger as of January 1, 2024 will compete in the junior division. All contestants ages 14 to 18 as of January 1, 2024 will compete in the senior division. <u>No contestant may have had their 19th birthday</u> prior to January 1, 2024.

You must submit the online Qualtrics form <u>AND</u> email a copy of the completed summary form. This will help us confirm entries and will be used to generate an invoice. Payment or proof of payment request as listed previously must be presented at check-in. <u>Please do NOT mail payment with your entry forms.</u>

Stockmen's Contest – The stockmen's contest is a test of general knowledge of livestock production. The 12-minute classes include:

- 20-25 question multiple choice quiz (100 points) two 12-minute rounds will be allocated for quiz completion
- identification of feeds, equipment, breeds, and retail meat cuts (50 points each class)
 - Seniors should be prepared to identify feed usage (Feed Usage Library sent in separate attachment)
 - o Retail meat ID will include species and retail cut, not wholesale cuts
 - judging of hay, retail meat cuts, and classes of live animals (50 points each class)
 - The contest may feature a data scenario with pictures and performance data (50 points) in place of one or more of the live animal judging classes.
 - Senior Contestants will have a nutritive analysis and scenario on the hay judging class
- Questions about judging classes (25 points each class)
- Group exercise/team problem for <u>senior teams</u> that members will complete together. Contestants are welcome to bring simple 4-function calculators for the senior team problem and quiz (junior and senior). Only simple 4-function calculators will be allowed – no cell phones or smart watches will be allowed in the contest. Contestants who are seen with or utilizing electronic devices will automatically be disqualified.

<u>Stockmen's Contest Eligibility</u> - Members who have previously participated in the National 4-H Skillathon contest are <u>not</u> eligible to participate in the B & B Stockman's contest as a 4-H or FFA contestant. Contest divisions and contestant eligibility are detailed in the summary table.

Stockmen's Contestant Responses: <u>All</u> stockmen's contest participants (junior and senior) will be scored using our Virginia Skillathon Scantron sheet. This form can be found at:

https://www.judgingcard.com/ScanSheets/samples/UnivD-VA-Skillathon.pdf A separate sheet with retail meat identification choices (species and retail cut) will be provided for the Meat ID station, and will be used to complete that portion of the scantron – contestants will need to identify the species (2 pts) and retail cut (3 pts). Points are awarded for each category. Please familiarize your contestants with this form before the contest. All contestants will need a clipboard and at least one No.2 pencil to complete the scantron sheet. Junior and senior contestants will compete in separate divisions and separate times of the day to accommodate contestant numbers and provide an age appropriate and positive experience for all contestants.

Livestock Judging Contest – This contest will consist of eight classes of beef cattle, swine, sheep, and meat goats. Performance data may be provided for at least one breeding class in each species. Ten questions will be asked on 2 classes. Contestants may have to judge breeding or market classes of each species. Market lambs may be handled in racks by all contestants – this will be at the discretion of the officials. Meat goats could be used for either a reasons or question class.

The Livestock Judging contest will be broken into four divisions:

- Junior Regular Livestock Judging and Senior Regular Livestock Judging these contestants will NOT give reasons and will judge after lunch on Saturday, February 24th
- Junior Advanced Livestock Judging and Senior Advanced Livestock Judging these contestants will place classes in the morning (February 24th) and give reasons in the afternoon at Litton Reaves (2 sets for Juniors and 4 sets for Seniors)

<u>Livestock Judging Eligibility</u> - Members who have previously participated in the National 4-H Livestock Judging contest or National FFA Livestock Evaluation CDE are <u>not</u> eligible to participate <u>under that organization</u> in this contest, but may compete for the other organization IF their eligibility is still valid for that group.

Summary of Stockmen's and Livestock Judging Contest Details

<u>Meats Judging Contest</u> – The contest will be held Saturday, March 2nd. This will be the Virginia State Contest for 4-H and FFA members.

- The contest will be broken into separate 4-H and FFA divisions.
- Youth are allowed to dual enter and compete in both the 4-H and FFA divisions.
- This will require youth to complete additional components as required by one or both divisions.
- Dual entered youth MUST be enrolled, eligible members of both the 4-H Unit and FFA Chapter they represent.
- <u>Contestants entered as either 4-H OR FFA will pay a \$15/person entry fee; Contestants who are Dual-Entered, competing as both 4-H AND FFA will pay a \$20/person entry fee. All meats contestants are provided lunch.</u>

***Please be aware that dual entered youth may be in different age divisions for 4-H vs FFA, as 4-H divisions are determined by their birthdate and FFA divisions are determined by grade level. These contestants will be required to complete the contest components of both divisions.

<u>Meats Contest Eligibility: Any participant who has competed in the National FFA Meats Evaluation CDE or the</u> <u>National 4-H Meats Evaluation is NOT eligible to compete for that organization.</u>

Quiz material will come from the Meat Science and Food Safety Microsoft PowerPoint found at: <u>https://store.icevonline.com/Meat-Science-Food-Safety_p_1184.html</u>. Please be aware that the PowerPoint is available from CEV and the cost is \$125.00, should you choose to purchase it.

<u>Meats Judging Contestant Responses -</u> Contestants will complete a Scantron form for all responses to the meat judging contest. This includes quiz, placings for judging classes, answers to questions, retail cut identification, and all the additional classes that are only in the FFA contest. Please familiarize your contestants with this form. The form is available at: <u>https://www.judgingcard.com/ScanSheets/samples/480-4-Meats.pdf</u>. To maintain cleanliness of the Scantron forms, contestants will be given a form resembling the Scantron form to complete while in the meats lab. Contestants will be given adequate time to transfer their responses to the Scantron after exiting the meats lab.

<u>a7a6d943036f.filesusr.com/ugd/4e58fc_700439c6410f407294b6d3a7a394fdfb.pdf</u>) contests. Contestants may be required to complete the beef grading portion of this contest on paper based on provided carcass measurements as enough beef carcasses may not be available.

Please remember, The National FFA Meat Evaluation and Technology CDE employs a <u>four-person team</u> format with no drop score, and therefore our state FFA meat judging contest will follow that system.

Classes in the judging portion of the contest can come from the following but are not limited to:

- Beef, pork, or lamb carcasses
- Wholesale cuts of beef, pork, or lamb
 - Including but not limited to: Ribs, loins, chucks, rounds, strips, and hams
- Retail Cuts of beef, pork or lamb

<u>Contests Attire</u> – In addition to wearing close toed shoes, contestants will be <u>required</u> to bring frocks, hard hats, and hair/beard nets for their own use in the meat judging contest, as we try to more closely follow the format on the national contest.
